We owe special thanks to our friends at Addingham Civic Society; Addingham WI; Addingham Primary School pupils for their project work and Choir for performing at the War Memorial; Addingham Churches together and the Addingham Singers.



The Heritage Group created the display in the Hub with the pictures and insights into the lives of brave men and women. Those who visited agreed it was extremely humbling.

The hugely anticipated Gala weekend returned with a packed programme in July. The committee left no stone unturned to ensure a safe and enjoyable event for everyone. Thank you to all who helped and supported.

In the last edition, we all enjoyed reading Cllr Peter Hindle's memories of D-Day. Sadly, Peter has passed away and the Parish Councillors and staff are adjusting to life without his straight talking approach to Council business.

You may not have known Cllr Peter Hindle personally, but you will have benefitted from his commitment to making the community of Addingham a better place to live and work.

The first of many of his accomplishments was the restoration of the Old Band O'le on Silsden Road, where he spent time keeping chickens and growing vegetables. As a builder by trade, we have had many jobs completed around the village thanks to his skills and experience. Coupled with this, he has turned his hand to anything that was asked of him, from replacing fence posts on allotments to cleaning the flagpole. Recently, he undertook the installation of many replacement benches around the village.

His work with the Council was not limited to maintenance and handy work. Peter took his Councillor role seriously and viewed it as a privilege to serve. His contributions to lively discussions were always shared with a calm head.

Peter was also the Chairman of Addingham United Charities, a role he valued and was deeply committed to. He really was the very best of us.

your memories. (more details in their article.)



At the time, I thought it was funny, but not all that strange. We used to get a lot of requests for baptisms and most weeks we'd open up the font and get the candles ready. Now the number of requests has collapsed, and we don't do many at all. This is such a shame. Baptism is a joyful turning point - as the service says:

" from darkness into marvellous light".

We have a new addition to the village – an information board about the history of Low Mill. Now everyone walking along the Dales Way can stop by the weir and read about the remarkable stories of Low Mill.



Low Mill



- As a world first in spinning worsted yarn in 1787
- As the scene of rioting in 1826
- As a contributor to the war effort building carburettors for Spitfires, Hurricanes and Lancasters.

Unveiling the board, Simon Tennant, chair of the Parish Council said: "This is another excellent example of close working between the Parish Council and the Civic Society for the good of Addingham". Gill Battarbee, chair of the Civic Society, said this was also a contribution to the aim of Bradford City of Culture 2025 to have a network of walks across the district.

### **Addingham Community Resilience Plan**

#### Cllr Catherine Coates writes:

For the last two years the Parish Council has been working alongside Bradford Council putting together a Community Resilience Plan, previously known as an Emergency Plan. The aim is for the Parish Council to have resources in place in case of an emergency. This could be due to a number of events such as flooding, power cuts or traffic accidents, a few of which we have already witnessed and attended locally.



The plan would only be implemented in a situation when emergency services or Council Officers could not attend. In this case **Bradford Council would** direct the Parish Council to implement the plan. Parish councillors have

and are undertaking training to cover the scenarios that we might face.

The Parish Council has a good understanding of the village and the areas of concern should an incident **occur.** However we are also very aware that we have a community with many residents and businesses that could also contribute to our team.

If you would like to join the Emergency Plan team we would love to hear from you. It could be that you have training, professional qualifications or a friendly nature and would be willing to help in an emergency event. Catering for anyone affected could be as simple as comforting and making a brew! We invite any residents to contact the Parish Council if they would like to be involved.

We also ask anyone who feels vulnerable to let us know how we could help them in a situation such as a power cut or a flood.



### **New Homes In Addingham**

Proposed reforms to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), the impact on national housing targets and implications for our village


#### **New Housing Targets**

The new Government has acted swiftly by increasing the annual target from the current 300,000 new homes per annum (pa) to 370,000 pa with 1,500,000 to be built by the next election.

It is worth noting that the last Government struggled to build 200,000 homes pa! **Housing quality** is to be addressed by the wider use of "Design Codes". There will be a higher percentage of "affordable" homes and homes for social rent. **Locally, in Yorkshire and the Humber Region**, the construction target has been increased from 18,699 to 27,433 pa.



There is a general consensus that England is in the grip of a housing crisis. The main reasons put forward are that insufficient houses are being built resulting in new homes being unaffordable for many potential purchasers. There are also questions as to whether these new houses are fit for purpose.



Consultation To facilitate these ambitious goals Government is consulting on the proposed reforms to the current National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), its overarching planning policy guidance. A consultation including 106 questions, was carried out during August and September, and the final version of the revised NPPF should be published by the end of the year, the results of which

will eventually be posted on the government website.

What does this mean for us? It would be good to give a simple answer as to how the proposed changes are likely to affect Addingham. However, nothing is straightforward in planning! Bradford is working on the next stage of its Local Plan, a Draft Regulation 19 document, identifying detailed sites to accommodate the requisite number of houses across the district.

Addingham Target the latest number is 175 houses over the next 15 years. It is unclear whether the uplift for Yorkshire and the Humber will have an impact on this number. Under the last Government Bradford was originally required to build 1,700 homes pa, a number subsequently increased to 2,295 homes pa (+35%) which is the figure currently being applied. However under the new Government's proposed calculation, the 35% uplift is being removed from the 20 largest cities (including Bradford) so the target drops to 2,089 homes pa thus casting doubt on our situation!

**In summary** it is not clear what the impact will be for Addingham but it will probably delay publication of Bradford's Draft Reg 19 report. However, there will be huge pressure on Local Authorities to get houses built and that will be felt in Addingham!
